Enhanced Provision

- Phoenix Primary School is a mainstream primary school with a 30 place Enhanced Provision which has been specially commissioned by Liverpool City Council, for girls and boys with complex learning difficulties (CLD)
- Pupils with CLD have a diagnosis of moderate learning difficulties (MLD) by an Educational Psychologist and another special educational need, this may include autistic spectrum conditions (ASC) or social, emotional and mental health needs (SEMH)

Details of the Phoenix Enhanced Provision

Venue	Pupils with Enhanced Provision placements learn in separate classes to the mainstream pupils, this is called discrete provision and may have opportunities to integrate into mainstream classes whenever possible, for specific subjects or activities.
